Trigeminal Neuralgia (TN)

One of the most painful afflictions known to medical practice.

TN is a disorder of the fifth cranial (trigeminal) nerve.

The classic form of the disorder (called TN1) causes extreme, sporadic, sudden burning or shock-like facial pain in the areas of the face where the branches of the nerve are distributed – lips, eyes, nose, scalp, forehead, upper jaw, and lower jaw.

Severe facial pain can last from a second to 15 minutes or longer; some individuals may have up to 100 lightning-like bursts of stabbing pain in a day.
